(www.domaineducervin.com). The owner, Samuel Gutknecht, was able to match the colour and flavour of our previous wine, so that the change has been almost imperceptible. We introduced this change for several reasons: 1) to support local farmers/vineyards 2) to be more environmentally friendly by avoiding shipping a product from thousands of miles away 3) to offer to God in Mass the fruits of the earth of our own region, and appreciate the amazing fact that Christ takes "the fruit of the vine and work of human hands," and all our spiritual offerings, and unites them to his own sacrifice to the Father, then returns these gifts to us in the form of His own Body and Blood.
