

November - Visit the Sick

Pray: Lord, give me the strength to be aware of the sick and their needs. Help me make time to visit them and give me an openness to be present with them, so that You may be present through me. Make me mindful of the gift of healing that I can bring, the healing that comes with compassion and tenderness. Amen.

Take Action:

- Volunteer at a hospital or a local nursing home.
- Visit and pray with those who are sick. If you don't know what to pray, try saying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy.
- Bring flowers, magazines, newspapers, library books or audio books when visiting someone in the hospital.
- Start a meal train for a family with a sick loved one.
- Volunteer to bring food to the homes of the elderly through a program like *Meals On Wheels*.
- Offer to buy and wrap Christmas gifts for someone who is sick and cannot go to the store themselves.
- Join OLMM's Prayer Shawl Ministry.
- Become a member of OLMM's Pastoral Care Team.
