

Development & Peace/Social Justice

You may not be aware that other than running two annual campaigns, D & P's work in advocating for social justice around the world continues all year round. Please take a look at the bulletin board in the downstairs hall for information about D & P's advocacy work for climate justice to learn more. This summer the Ottawa area offers many opportunities to learn about and interact with Indigenous culture. The May 27, 28 weekend features the annual pow wow (music & dance competion, sales of Indigenous crafts, art, jewellery, and traditional foods) organised by the Odawa Native Friendship Centre. Admission is free. The site is 200 Moodie Drive, near the Maple Hills Urban Farm. 417 to Moodie exit. Friday, June 2nd is the date to celebrate the second year since the release of Canada's Truth & Reconciliation Commission's final report by gathering at Parliament Hill to participate in the Really Big/Kitche Blanket Learning Exercise, beginning at 5:00 pm.

This is an interactive enactment of the full story of Canada's colonial history and the beginnings of her relationship with the Indigenous Peoples of this land. You didn't learn this story in school.
