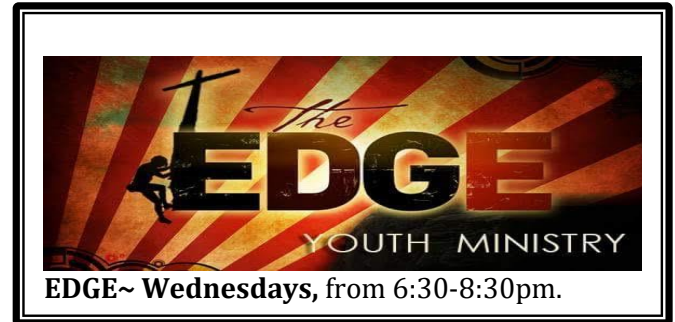

This fall, OLMM is offering Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) Level 1 for children aged 3-5 years old (born in 2012, 2013, 2014) and **Level 2** for 6-8 years old (born in 2009, 2010, 2011). CGS is a Montessori approach to sharing the Christian faith with children. Together with trained catechists, children will listen to and wonder about scripture, and be engaged in elements of the Church in a space called the atrium. This past year we welcomed 12 children in Level 1 and 12 children in Level 2. The cost is \$150 for one child, \$100 for each additional child in the family. DEVELOPMENT & PEACE SOCIAL JUSTICE

I am writing to invite you to join the Spiritual Elders of the sacred Algonquin Peoples' worship, prayer, & healing site, called Akikodjiwan in the Anishinabe language of the Algonquin Peoples. This sacred site, which has been a prayer & worship ground for centuries for the Algonquin Indigenous Peoples, is facing complete desecration by Windmill Corporation, who has won the right from the city of Ottawa and the federal government to build a huge condominium and retail development on Victoria Island, one of the 3 islands in the Ottawa River, along with the Chaudière Falls, that comprise the sacred Akikowjiwan site. This is a threat to the Algonquin Peoples' right to practise their spirituality, a right guaranteed under the Canadian Charter of Rights & Freedom. It is no different than any a church, Mosque or synagogue being threatened with destruction in the name of profit. The Algonquin Elders are inviting us to support their right to worship on sacred ground by joining them to walk from Victoria Island to Parliament Hill on Friday, June 23rd between 10:00 am & 1:00 pm. We will begin at 10:00 am with traditional Algonquin prayers, welcoming songs, & an opening address by celebrated spiritual Elder Albert Dumont. Please see the posters in the church.
