Reflection

When we reflect on today's readings, we are reminded of a few things: 1) our life on earth is challenging because we are placed in the battle between GOoD (GOD) and (d)evil; 2) on our own, there is no way we can win the battle; and 3) because of the loving mercy of our GOD as manifested in the teaching, actions, suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus, we are being invited to be daughters and sons of our Abba and sisters and brother of the Lord Jesus, all in the unity of the Holy Spirit.

The Second Person of the Blessed Trinity became human in order to take on the battle and win the ultimate victory over (d)evil. We must do our part in the skirmishes we face in facing the worldly ways and in proclaiming the GOoDness of GOD's reign.

Tied into this is that we cannot earn heavenly benefits. Our sins have caused a break in our relationship with our loving GOD. We need to admit our guilt, even though we can never fully counteract the wrongs we have done.

That leads us to the promise of redemption as demonstrated in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. GOD is not only willing to forgive us (which was done by Jesus on the cross and at the empty tomb), but GOD continues to welcome us into the Divine Family as adopted daughters and sons of our Abba and co-heirs with Jesus, our Brother. It is because of the overwhelming kindness of our GOD that we can live lives of proclaiming the GOoD news that we are saved. We can follow the model of our Brother Jesus in doing GOD's will and caring for all our sisters and brothers, especially those who are most in need of our help. Let us continue to proclaim today's responsorial: "With the LORD there is mercy and fullness of redemption."

The personal question/action for today: How do I react when I am confronted with my own sinfulness? Do I seek to blame others, the devil, or even GOD? How do I "cover-up" my sinfulness? What is my reaction when I think about the forgiveness and loving mercy which GOD offers me through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus? How do I live out my gratefulness to GOD for the kindness which I have been shown? What can I do to help others experience the loving forgiveness of GOD and the invitation to be part of the family of GOD?
