Reflection

As we reflect on the readings we realize a few things: 1) it is GOD who gives the growth; 2) something small and apparently insignificant can grow into something huge and beneficial not only for itself, but also for others;

3) sometimes it takes quite a while for growth to reach its full potential.

GOD is the source of all positive development and growth. Without GOD, nothing of any maintainable value will persist. We, as we heard on the Fifth Sunday of Easter, must continue to be firmly attached to the source of life-giving growth (like branches on the vine). It is from Jesus, the Vine, that we receive what we need to grow into good fruit producers.

Although we may consider ourselves as insignificant and rather ordinary, we can be the source of much growth. What we do to the least of Jesus' sisters and brothers can become huge in the course of a virtuous cycle. Think about how the church began with a bunch of fishers and a tax collector and few odd individuals and has become the largest community of the believers in the world. We can have a positive effect on others.

It has been said about the earthly development of individuals, "GOD isn't through with me yet!" Our life is an ongoing process of GOD's making us into the person GOD has intended us to be. It is not finished as long as we live on the earth, and according to some, the process continues throughout all eternity, but in a not-so burdensome way. We are becoming who GOD wants us to be. The more we cooperate with GOD, the more peaceful the process will be. Just as it takes thousands of year for the redwood seed to increase 300 thousand million times, so we should not expect a total transformation overnight.

The personal question/action for today: In what areas have I seen a growth in myself over the course of the last week, the last month, the last year, the last ten years?

Can I see the hand of GOD at work in my life? When have I been impressed about how GOD has used me for the good of others, even though I am a sinful, but saved individual? In what areas of my life do I need GOD to work? How can I reach out to others and help them realize that GOD is working in their lives?

This fall, OLMM is offering Catechesis of the Good

Shepherd (CGS) Level 1 for children aged 3-5 years old (born in 2013- 2015), Level 2 for 6-8 years old (born in 2010-2012) and Level 3 for 9-11years old (born in 2007-2009). CGS is a Montessori approach to sharing the Christian faith with children. Together with trained catechists, children will listen to and wonder about scripture, and be engaged in elements of the Church in a space called the atrium. The cost is \$200.00 for one child, \$100 for each additional child in the family. Payment plan options available upon request. Please pick up registration forms in the foyer or at the parish office. Space is limited. Drop off completed forms to the parish office. As Catholics, we have a precious treasure, one that we not only possess but also can help others to share with us. That treasure is our faith, and we may have friends or relatives who are thinking about becoming Catholic, or may need just a suggestion or question from us to consider joining the Catholic Church. Once they have made a decision to explore the faith, we have a program called RCIA, which stands for the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults, to teach them about and guide them on their journey. Whether the person is baptised, not baptised, or even a Catholic who has not been confirmed, this program provides instruction on the basics of the faith. RCIA not only teaches on the intellectual level; it also helps the person to develop in their faith on the spiritual level. The program will be starting in the fall. If you know someone who could be a candidate for becoming Catholic, please invite them to contact the parish office for more details.
