'No sooner had I arrived (at my new parish), seeing all the work I had to do, that I realized that if I were not helped by the prayers of many people, it would be difficult to obtain all the graces necessary to sanctify all these souls. One thought came to me incessantly in my meditation, especially before the Blessed Sacrament: in our times, more than ever, it is necessary to obtain for priests more numerous graces, in keeping with the more serious circumstances in which we are living. In my instructions and my homilies, I often asked for the prayers of my parishioners and explained to them that it is a duty imposed on them by the Fourth Commandment of God, to pray for the priests, who are the spiritual fathers of the faithful.'
