

♦ PRAYER FOR PRIESTS: In asking for your prayers for priests, I would like to share with you this quote from Fr. Alexis Louis Mangin, founder of the Servants of Jesus and Mary (written in the 1890's):

'No sooner had I arrived (at my new parish), seeing all the work I had to do, that I realized that if I were not helped by the prayers of many people, it would be difficult to obtain all the graces necessary to sanctify all these souls.

One thought came to me incessantly in my meditation, especially before the Blessed Sacrament: in our times, more than ever, it is necessary to obtain for priests more numerous graces, in keeping with the more serious circumstances in which we are living. In my instructions and my homilies, I often asked for the prayers of my parishioners and explained to them that it is a duty imposed on them by the Fourth Commandment of God, to pray for the priests, who are the spiritual fathers of the faithful.'

As some of you know, we recently had a pilgrimage/retreat to St. Joseph's Oratory with the Grade 6 students of Mother Theresa on November 2. I never tire of visiting St. Joseph's or reading about Brother Andre! Now that we have our own little shrine to St. Joseph, we can easily call upon the foster father of Jesus in all our needs, without traveling to Montreal, but simply by lighting a little candle in the back of our own Church!

Whenever people visited Brother Andre asking for help, healings and miracles, he would give them simple advice such as: "Make a novena to St. Joseph. Go to confession and Holy Communion, " and so on.

I came across this prayer to St. Joseph from the Josephinian Prayer Movement: "Hail Joseph, son of David (Mt 1:20)/ vicar of the Father/ nourisher of the Son,/ depository of the Holy Spirit,/ Blessed are you among men/ and blessed is your beloved Jesus./ Righteous among the righteous,/ spouse of Mary,/ provide for us your children/, now and at the hour of our death." They recommend praying a novena by offering 9 "Hail Joseph's" a day for 9 days, introducing and briefly specifying, after the words "provide for us, your children," the desired favour (for example 'the recovery of . . . ' a job for . . . ' 'peace in the family for . . .' 'the conversion of . . . ' etc . . .). After the 9 "Hail Joseph's" say: "St. Joseph, I thank you for hearing me. I know that you always hear me." (Jn 11: 41-2).

Here's another "Hail Joseph" that is reminiscent of the structure of the "Hail Mary": "Hail Joseph, the just/ steward of grace./ Blessed are you among men,/ and blessed is your Immaculate Spouse, Mary./ Holy Joseph, father of Jesus,/ Pray for us sinners,/ now and at the hour of our death."

We must use some words in our prayer, but let us not get caught up in words. Let us put our trust in Jesus, Mary and Joseph!
