Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I would like to explain some of my remarks from last week's homily and the part on modesty, specifically, my use of the word "scum." I wanted to use strong language to express the problem of lust in our culture, the lust in the hearts of men that leads them to look upon women as objects instead of persons. I did not mean to imply that any of these men, or any human being, is or could be "scum." It is too late to take back these words, but at least on the written copy of my homily, I have changed the wording to "I don't want my sisters in Christ to be slimed by men who are slaves of lust." As it has been pointed out to me, we must pray for these men, and as men and women, as brothers and sisters in Christ, work together to purify our hearts and our gazes. As the Catechism puts it, "purity of heart . . . enables us to see according to God . . . it lets us perceive the human body ours and our neighbour's - as a temple of the Holy Spirit, as the 9:00 & 10:45 am. On an entirely different note, for the readers in our parish, I would like to propose a CATHOLIC BOOK CLUB ON DANTE, and offer the unique opportunity to read the greatest Catholic writer in history, and his famous trilogy, The Divine Comedy. I am planning to re-read it, and invite others to join me.

On the sixth centenary of the poet's death, Pope Benedict XV wrote: "while there is no lack of great Catholic poets who combine the useful with the enjoyable, Dante has the singular merit that while he fascinates the reader with wonderful variety of pictures, with marvellously lifelike colouring, with supreme expression and thought, he draws him also to the love of Christian knowledge, and all know how he said openly that he composed his poem to bring to all 'vital nourishment.' And we know now too how, through God's grace, even in recent times, many who were far from, though not averse to Jesus Christ, and studied with affection the Divina Commedia, began by admiring the truths of the Catholic Faith and finished by throwing themselves with enthusiasm into the arms of the Church" (In Praeclara Summorum, #8).

The Book Club would consist of independent reading. I propose that we meet 3 times for discussion, one for each book. It think three months is enough to read each one, so we could tentatively meet in late August or early September to discuss The Inferno. We will be reading the translation by Hollander, published by Anchor Books, and available through Amazon for \$15-20 each. Let me know if you are interested! Fr. Tim
