PASTOR'S CORNER

We have just celebrated the feast of **St. Joseph** (March 19th) husband of Mary and patron of Canada. There was a special accent on the feast this year at the Oratory, since this is the first year we celebrate it in union with our recently canonized St. Andre of Montreal. I am always inspired by my visits to St. Joseph's Oratory, and I recommend to any parishioner who has not yet been – plan to go! It is only 1 hour and 45 minutes away, and it's the largest shrine to St. Joseph in the world!

I believe that St. Joseph has a special mission in the Church and the world today, connected with **fatherhood**. Joseph is the icon of God the Father. The statue or image of Joseph holding the child Jesus invites us all to trust in God as our Father. In our times, we desperately need to recover this sense of God as our Creator and Father; from this faith flows an appreciation of the beauty and gift of creation, of our own lives, and of each human being.

Brother Andre believed that during the political upheavals of the early 20th century, Canada was saved from Communism through the intercession of St. Joseph. Let us pray for the ongoing intercession of St. Joseph to save us from the culture of death, and to help us guard and cherish life as the greatest gift of our Father-God.
