

PASTOR'S CORNER

While Mark Lalonde and I are on our mission trip to Honduras, we have the opportunity to meet "the poor" but also reflect on the various forms of poverty in human life. I am touched by our Pope's comments in his social encyclical "Caritas in Veritate" in which he writes:

"One of the deepest forms of poverty a person can experience is isolation. If we look closely at other kinds of poverty, including material forms, we see that they are born from isolation, from not being loved or from difficulties in being able to love. Poverty is often produced by a rejection of God's love, by man's basic and tragic tendency to close in on himself, thinking himself to be self-sufficient or merely an insignificant and ephemeral fact, a "stranger" in a random universe. Man is alienated when he is alone, when he is detached from reality, when he stops thinking and believing in a foundation."

The Holy Father continues: "all of humanity is alienated when too much trust is placed in merely human projects, ideologies and false utopias. Today humanity appears much more interactive than in the past: this shared sense of being close to one another must be transformed into true communion. The development of peoples depends, above all, on a recognition that the human race is a single family working together in true communion, not simply a group of subjects who happen to live side by side"

Let us continue to pray and work, each in his or her own way, for this integral development of all peoples, rich and poor.

Number Two: Why New Words?

The language in which we pray together at Mass is special, a simple, dignified, formal way of talking to God. The language we use to speak with God should sound different than the everyday speech we use with our friends to help us remember Who we are praying to - God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. Some parts of the New Mass will have noticeable changes, such as the Gloria or the Creed, but other parts have not changed, such as the Our Father. Many prayers at Mass will sound a little different than the words we have used for the last 30 years but this will give us a new opportunity to listen carefully to what we are saying when we pray. There is an expression that reminds us that what we pray shows and teaches what we believe: lex orandi, lex credendi. It is quite amazing to think that the words we will be using are close to the way Catholic Christians prayed for many centuries: it is proof of the timeless and enduring faith of the Church that we will hand on to the next generation of Catholic Christians.

BATTLE OF THE BANDS John A. Logan once said "Music is the medicine of the mind". In an effort to combine both music and medicine; on Saturday, May 28th 2011, the first Bands Battling for Cheo will be hosted in support of Chez 106's Doc and Woody fund. During this event, Ottawa-area youth bands will be competing for a six-hour recording session at Addictive Sound. The event will be judged by music professionals, including the owner of Addictive Sound, and all money raised will aid in supplying the Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario (CHEO) with necessary operating tables, so that children undergoing surgery will be as safe as possible.
