

To Follow Christ

The young man in the gospel had the desire to follow Christ, to be saved, but unfortunately was not willing to give up his possessions. Jesus loved him so much as much as he loves each and every one of us. And just like the young man, he invites us to follow him, to imitate his love and generosity especially to the poor. The gospel applies to all us; it makes us face up to ourselves and our unwillingness to give up those attachments that prevent us from belonging to Jesus and following him without holding back.

Happiness versus Wealth

Happiness does not come from wealth. Money can't buy happiness. Rather happiness consists of interior detachment and honest, sincere search for the love of Christ. Blessed John Paul II puts it beautifully thus: "If you wish to talk to Christ and to accept all the truth of his testimony, you must on the one hand 'love the world' – for God 'so loved the world that he gave his only son' (Jn 3:16) – and at the same time you must acquire interior detachment with regard to all this rich and fascinating reality that makes up 'the world."" True happiness comes when we acknowledge our need for God and are willing to 'sell' every other thing so as to make it our own.

Today's message challenges us to ask ourselves what is there in my life that possesses me more than Jesus does. What do I find impossible to give up? May we always be open to the Lord's invitation to live in his presence.

EDUCATION CORNER:

Introduction to the Nicene Creed - Part One. One recommendation from Pope Benedict XVI for the *Year of Faith* is to learn by heart the Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed (also called the Nicene Creed). The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that the "Nicene Creed draws its great authority from the fact that it stems from the first two ecumenical Councils (in 325 and 381). It remains common to all the great Churches of both East and West to this day (n. 195)." In the new Missal, we see a fresh translation of the creed that introduces a number of additions and clarifications to the creed in the previous Missal. These changes reflect a closer translation from the original Latin containing important articulations of our faith. This year, using the *Catechism* as our guide, we will examine this foundational expression of our faith more closely.
