To Love God

FOR THE PARISH BULLETIN: Introduction to the Nicene Creed - Part Four.

We profess in the creed "I BELIEVE IN ONE LORD JESUS CHRIST, THE ONLY BEGOTTEN SON OF GOD." The name "Jesus" in Hebrew means "God saves" and "Christ" is a Greek version of the Hebrew word "Messiah" or "anointed one." The name "Jesus" signifies that the very name of God is present in the person of his Son, made man for the universal and definitive redemption from sins (*Catechism*, nn. 430, 436, 432). Thus "Jesus Christ" is both Jesus' name and a title establishing his identity as the promised Messiah, the Anointed one. The *Catechism* reminds us that Jesus was truly God's Son and not just a very holy man adopted by God: "The Gospels report that at two solemn moments, the Baptism and the Transfiguration of Christ, the voice of the Father designates Jesus his 'beloved Son'" (*Catechism*, n. 444). The very name of Jesus tells us something about God's love for us and His plan for redeeming us.
