~YEAR OF FAITH~

Introduction to the Nicene Creed -Part Eight. This week we look at the phrase "THROUGH HIM [Christ] ALL THINGS WERE MADE." This phrase tells us something important about how God works in creation. "The New Testament reveals that God created everything by the eternal Word, his beloved Son. In him 'all things were created, in heaven and on earth... all things were created through him and for him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together'" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 291). Why did God create the universe and everything in it? St. Bonaventure teaches us that God creates "not to increase his glory, but to show it forth and to communicate it, for God has no other reason for creating than his love and goodness" (CCC, n. 293). God did not create the universe in a big bang and then step back: He loves and cares about His creation. God creates out of love and He communicated that love to us definitively by sending His Son, Jesus, to us to save us from the forces of sin and death.
