


EPIPHANY OF THE LORD January 6, 2013

~YEAR OF FAITH~

Introduction to the Nicene Creed - Part Fourteen. We are continuing to unpack some of the theology behind the expression "I BELIEVE IN THE HOLY SPIRIT... WHO PROCEEDS FROM THE FATHER AND THE SON." This famous Western formulation is a difference between Eastern and Western theology that goes by the description in Latin "the Filioque" debate. "Filio" means "the Son" and "que," when added to the end of a word, acts as the conjunction "and": Filioque thus means "and the Son". In Roman or Latin theology, we say that the Holy Spirit proceeds from and unites the Father and the Son. Eastern theology teaches that the Father alone is the ultimate source of Divinity hence they say the Spirit proceeds from Father. In some respects, this debate is really about different ways of expressing fundamentally the same idea that the Spirit is Divine as the Father and the Son are Divine: three Divine Persons – Father, Son and Spirit – but one God: "WHO WITH THE FATHER AND THE SON IS ADORED AND GLORIFIED."

Introduction to the Nicene Creed - Part Fifteen:

This week we are beginning the final part of the *Creed with our statement in the belief of the four* marks of the Church: "I BELIEVE IN ONE, HOLY, CATHOLIC, AND APOSTOLIC CHURCH." The Church with a capital "C" is one as it is united to God through Jesus Christ, the Head of the Mystical Body of Christ. It confesses one faith, one Lord, one baptism, forms one Body, is given life by one Spirit and confesses one hope (CCC, n. 866). The Church is holy because it is the Bride of Christ and is composed of God's people, but at the same time it is composed of sinners like you and me. It is at once holy, divine and human: "she is the sinless one made up of sinners" (CCC, n. 867). The word "Catholic" means universal or pertaining to everyone, because Church it is not for just a handpicked few. "Apostolic" asserts our real and continuing connection to Christ through the Apostles: the college of bishops united with the Pope continues today the Apostolic ministry of Christ's Apostles.
