Introduction to the Nicene Creed - Part Sixteen

The last line of the Creed is: "I CONFESS ONE BAPTISM FOR THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS." We don't use the word "confess" often today but it has a strong connotation of professing or holding firmly. Early Christians who were persecuted for holding to their faith were called "confessors of the faith." We believe that the sacrament of baptism washes away the stain of original sin as well as forgives sins that were committed before baptism. In the early Church, adults sometimes postponed being baptized because they were worried about committing sins after being baptized. Catholic Christians believe that the sacrament of baptism cannot be repeated – if we were validly baptized it cannot be repeated – which is why we accept the valid baptism of a person from another Christian community. Not all Christian denominations, however, accept this practice and so some communities insist that new members be baptized, especially if they were baptized as infants.
