

The whole point of the temptation story is how He struggled within Himself to find the most effective way to bring people to God. We humans are hardly tempted to try turning stones into bread, for such a thing is quite impossible for us. It could only be a temptation for a man of unique power. Jesus, in the first temptation, seems to toy with the possibility of winning followers by miracles, providing a limitless supply of free bread for people. Jesus saw how material wealth easily can lead to an erosion of religious values, as he was to say later.

Next, being taken up to the mountain-top and being shown all the kingdoms of the world — this temptation for Christ was to become a secular messiah, who would use political means to make people turn to God. He dismisses this too, knowing that people will enter into a true union with God, if, and only if, they are drawn by the Holy Spirit. The third and final temptation was to become a messiah of a sensational kind, the kind that so many people wanted – since throughout His public life they kept asking for signs. What if He were to throw Himself from off the pinnacle of the Temple and rise unscathed. But Jesus saw quite clearly that this had no genuine value, so He said, "You must not put the Lord your God to the test!" as a warning to Himself not to be rash and superficial.

The conviction formed in His mind that his final and fullest way of service to mankind, the effective one that would endure, would be through suffering and the Cross, after which would come the crown. Without His crucifixion Jesus Christ would long since be forgotten. In every event of Christ's earthly life, God is saying something to us too. The story of the Temptations is surely a warning to us not to allow purely selfish considerations to govern our lives. We must try and be guided by the Holy Spirit, who continues to speak to us in our conscience throughout our stay on this earth. Imitate Christ by taking up the Cross everyday, not with an air of gloomy resignation, but with a cheerful acceptance of what the daily round may bring. Try and make Jesus a dominating influence in our lives, reflect upon His words and actions with reverence and affection, so as to bring about an inner purification of our minds and wills.
