

True Kingship Means Dying for the People

In today's gospel, the Jewish leaders derided Christ by asking Him to save Himself from the agony of the cross if He was the Christ of God and a king. We also recall Pilate who asked Him if He was the King of the Jews. He said to him: My kingdom is not from this world. He meant that His kingdom does not depend on armies and bombs and missiles. His Kingdom is a kingdom of justice, truth, love and peace. This is the type of kingdom any well-meaning person would like to belong to; to be under the Lordship of Jesus and to know His Peace for "as long as individuals and the state refuse to submit to the rule of our savior, there would be no really hopeful prospect of lasting peace among nations." We must look for the peace of Christ in the kingdom of Christ by whose death and resurrection we are freed from sin and death.

November – Visit the Sick

- Offer to buy and wrap Christmas gifts for someone who is sick and cannot go to the store themselves.

- Join OLMM's Prayer Shawl Ministry.

- Become a member of OLMM's Pastoral Care Team.
