In the mass, the breaking of the bread, the risen Jesus is present among us as one who heals, feeds, consoles and forgives us.

Perspective

The gospel story on this third Sunday of Easter is about two men who apparently lost their perspective while on a journey. For them, the death of Jesus was a great blow because they had hoped that He would be the answer to their problems. Even with the astonishing news of the empty tomb, they still failed to put two and two together. However, when Jesus appeared, explained the meaning of the scriptures to them, and broke bread with them, they got things straightened out!

The Mass

Like the disciples, we too are on a journey. Our real home, our lasting home, is with our father in heaven. Also, like the two men we can lose our perspective while away from home; we can get out of touch with reality, lost in the distractions of everyday life, and become confused and discouraged. What do we need? We need our own personal Emmaus! We need a place where we can get things straightened out again. The mass, "the breaking of the bread", is our personal Emmaus. Every Sunday, indeed at every mass, Jesus speaks to us; He reveals Himself and invites us to follow Him.

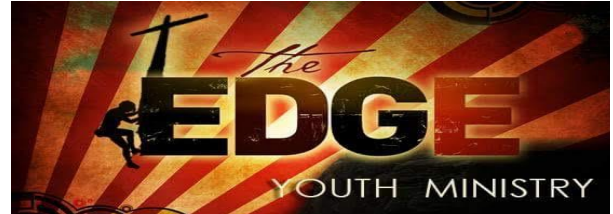
