December 8. The Feast of the Immaculate Conception

Many Christians around the world, particularly those of the Catholic faith, mark the Feast of the Immaculate Conception in their diaries and calendars. Church services honoring this observance are held on or around December 8. The Feast of the Immaculate Conception is a public holiday in many places around the world. Theological controversy surrounded the Feast of the Immaculate Conception for centuries. However, popular celebration of this holiday dates back to at least the eighth century. The argument related to the meaning of the word "immaculate", which in this context refers to the belief that Jesus' mother Mary was conceived without original sin, according to Christian belief. Many theologians throughout Christian history, including St Thomas Aquinas, questioned the Immaculate Conception. It remained open for debate for many years until **Pope** Pius IX proclaimed it to be an essential dogma in the Catholic Church on December 8, 1854. The written document on this is known as the Ineffabilis Deus. Since then, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception celebrates the belief that Mary was born without sin and that God chose her to be Jesus' mother.

Please join us on Friday, December 8th, at 7:00pm for a special mass for the Feast of the Immaculate Conception in honor of OLMM. At this mass we will also celebrate the anniversary of the foundation of the Salvatorian Fathers. We are happy to welcome a couple of visiting Salvatorian fathers who along with Fr. Robert will renew their vows, A reception will follow in the parish hall. Everyone is welcome!

December 8 Marks the Anniversary of the Foundation of the Salvatorian Fathers

As a member of the Society of the Divine Savior religious order I wanted to share with you some of our history and the importance of December 8 to we, its members, [priests, brothers and sisters] as the date of the anniversary of our foundation.

The Society of the Divine Saviors [SDS], also known as the Salvatorian religious order was established on December 8, 1881 in Rome [the historical heart of the Church] by Fr. Francis Jordan its Founder, when he and three other priests took private vows as members of the Apostolic Teaching Society at the Chapel of St Brigida. Today, the Salvatorians minister in 40 countries throughout the world with about 1200 priests and religious.

On December 8 annually, Salvatorian Fathers all over the world make an annual renewal of these vows, as follows:

"Lord Jesus Christ, Savior of the World. I desire to follow You faithfully and to serve You and Your work of Salvation.

Today, I rededicate myself to You in Your Church without reserve to a life of apostolic service in the Society of the Divine Savior. Therefore, in the presence of the community, I reconfirm my will of obeying for life my religious vows of celibate chastity, poverty, and obedience according to the constitution of our Society. At the same time, I trust in the help of our Blessed Lady, Mother of the Savior, and all the

patrons of the Society, as well as the daily help of my confreres. Accept, O Lord, my recommitment of obeying religious vows and with Your grace strengthen my

resolution to fulfill all my life what I have vowed. Amen."

Though Fr. Jordan originally named our Order the 'Apostolic Teaching Society' the name was later changed to 'The Catholic Teaching Society', and then to 'The Society of the Divine Savior' (in Latin: Societas Divini Salvatoris) and ever since then the Society has been known as "The Salvatorians".

This change of name was fortunate because the new Society no longer took its name from its activities, as it did in the beginning, but from its highest ideal: Christ Himself, the Savior of the World. He is our model and it is to Him that we aim to draw others.
