# INTENTIONS OF THE HOLY FATHER FOR MARCH: Catholics in China

We pray that the Church in China may persevere in its faithfulness to the Gospel and grow in unity.

#### GOSPEL REFLECTION

Our readings for this second Sunday of Lent offer us Christian stewards motivation to continue on our 40-day journey towards deeper holiness.

The first reading from the book of Genesis describes God's call to Abraham. God instructs Abraham to leave his home and set out to a land that God had chosen for him. Abraham's response is an ancient example of a good stewardship. Instead of clinging to his comfortable way of life, to the only home he has ever known, he recognizes that all he has is gift from God, puts his trust in God and obeys. And God rewards him saying, "I will make your name great, so that you will be a blessing." To "be a blessing" is the true aim of a stewardship way of life. It is also an excellent way to live out the season of Lent. The sacrifices we take on, the spiritual disciplines we practice, the extra acts of service we perform during this season — all give glory to God and transform our lives into a blessing for others.

St. Paul encourages us on this path in our second reading taken from his letter to Timothy. "Bear your share of hardship for the gospel..." adding this critical phrase, "with the strength that comes from God." On our own we are weak, inclined towards selfishness and comfort seeking. Relying on God's strength, however, we can persevere in the fight to attain holiness. Paul reminds us that, in fact, we were made for this! "God saved us and called us to a holy life."

To be "holy" means to be set apart for God. This means that our lives as Christian stewards will look different from those around us who do not know the Lord — but different in a way that is attractive, that draws them to the Lord as well. It is a way of life that is counter-cultural in our individualistic, "me first" day and age. The generous offering to God of our time, talents and treasure at times can feel like the "hardship" Paul mentions in our second reading. But this way of life is a path to holiness. Lest we grow weary on this path, our Gospel passage today, from Matthew, offers us a powerful image of the great God we serve. It is the story of the Transfiguration of Jesus, when our Lord takes His key apostles up to a high mountain and reveals Himself in His true glory.

#### ADDRESSING THE ISSUE OF THE CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) FROM ARCHBISHOP PRENDERGAST

At the Archdiocese, we are being asked how we should prepare in the Church to help our churchgoers feel secure and to avoid panic. The best precautions being recommended are to wash one's hands, to cough into one's sleeve and to avoid touching one's face. We should remind our people that if they are unwell, they should stay home: the Sunday obligation does not bind those who are ill. Other steps that should be taken include: having disinfectants available at the entrance to our churches and in the sacristy; to suspend the greeting of peace and the reception of Holy Communion from the chalice (except for those who are gluten intolerant or have celiac disease); to insist that Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion disinfect their hands before carrying out this ministry. Let's follow these precautions throughout Lent, unless and until other decisions are taken.
