ARCHBISHOP'S MESSAGE

January 15, 2021

Dealing with lockdown realities

As we enter another provincial lockdown phase with attendance at Mass limited to ten people in total, parishioners (and priests) have many questions. I am hearing concern about the seeming contradiction between the message by Premier Ford to please stay home and avoid unnecessary travel and the provision that our parishes may remain open for religious services, including Mass, with ten people or less and following all the necessary health and safety measures. The Premier is allowing the public to determine for themselves what necessary travel is, relying on the public's discretion to avoid making frequent trips for unnecessary reasons. It is important to note that the province has not closed our churches. Because of our ongoing dialogue with government authorities and our excellent protocols established in our churches, they recognize that we offer our society an essential service for the spiritual and mental well-being of our people. Parishes can therefore continue to offer Mass with the restriction on attendance to ten people in total, along with confession and individual prayer time, as long as we continue to follow the established protocols. As we enter the week of Prayer for Christian Unity, let us be mindful that we are all struggling during this pandemic, but united in faith and prayer, we can support each other in charity.

Please continue to pray for me, as I do for you.
